The Conference will host special panels and sessions in at least the following areas: Phenomenology of Space, Phenomenology and Ancient Philosophy, Phenomenological Readings of German Idealism, The Philosophy of Eugen Fink. We welcome individual presentations but also suggestions for joint panels on current topics and recently published books.
