



Wergeland and Holst Scholarships in Israel

The Hebrew University of Jerusalem is pleased to announce the "Thanks To Scandinavia" (TTS) Scholarships for students from the Scandinavian countries for participation in the Rothberg International School's Summer Program 2011.

Thanks To Scandinavia is an educational foundation dedicated to expressing lasting gratitude to those countries and people who helped to rescue Jews during World War II. TTS works to build bridges of understanding, cooperation and shared values today by granting scholarships to Scandinavians and Bulgarians primarily for study in the United States and in Israel. Scholarships are awarded by the TTS Foundation in New York, in memory of Henrik Wergeland – an early 19th century poet and thinker from Norway who, defending Enlightenment thinking, pressed successfully for the legalization of Norwegian citizenship for Norwegian Jews, marking the beginnings of the Jewish community in his country and Johan Jørgen Holst, the late Norwegian Foreign Minister, who led historic efforts to achieve peace between Israel and the Palestinians, as part of the Oslo peace process.

SUMMER 2011: In 2011, nine scholarships will be awarded as follows: two in Denmark, two in Finland, two in Sweden, and three in Norway. Applicants are eligible to receive a scholarship of \$2500 US, to apply toward application, tuition and housing fees.

STUDY PROGRAM: The language of instruction is English. Students may enroll in either one language course (4-5 weeks, program dates vary) or one of the Summer Courses offered (June 28-July 25).
