PUBLIC TRANSPORT

Single ticket from a machine 2,90 €. 1 day ticket 9,00 €. You can use: trams, buses, metro, Suomenlinna ferry and commuter trains in Helsinki.

Sightseeing: A great way to experience the city is to hop on tram 2 or 3.

Ferries to Suomenlinna: The public ferry (HSL) to Suomenlinna operates all year round. In summertime you can also take a water bus (JT-Line) that stops at the islands of Vallisaari and Lonna.

 AIRPORT TRANSPORTATION

Trains: Around 30 minutes from Central Railway Station. Train lines I and P. Buy a regional ticket in advance. Regional single ticket 5,00 €, regional 1 day ticket 14,00 €.

Finnair City Bus: From the Central Railway Station every 20 min. You can purchase tickets from the driver.

Taxis: Estimated cost from the city centre 40–50 €.

Classics

1. Helsinki Cathedral and Senate Square
One of the most recognisable symbols of Helsinki and its silhouette since 1852.

2. Tori Quarters
The historical centre. The narrow streets are lined with restaurants, cafés and design shops.

3. Uspenski Cathedral
One of the largest Orthodox churches in Western Europe. Beautiful icons and paintings.

4. Esplanade Park
The main avenue, a place to relax and watch the people stroll by.

5. Market Square and Sightseeing Cruises
Traditional open-air market sells local food and souvenirs. Sightseeing cruises depart from the waterfront.

6. Sibelius Monument and Park
The monument is one of the most popular attractions in Helsinki, designed by Eila Hiltunen.

Saunas

21. Allas Sea Pool
The amazing new spa complex has a large pool area and saunas. In addition to swimming, bathing and good food, Allas offers many wellness and entertainment options. Close by you see all the best sights of Helsinki in 10 minutes with the *Flytour XD* and take a ride on *SkyWheel Helsinki*.

22. Yrjönkatu Swimming Hall (Open Sep–May)
The oldest public swimming hall in Finland features historically and artistically noteworthy architecture. Separate swimming days for men and women.

23. Löyly
At the impressive Löyly design sauna you can experience a traditional wood-heated or smoke sauna, take a dip in the Baltic Sea and enjoy great food with a breathtaking view.

24. Kotiharjun Sauna
Opened back in 1928, Kotiharju is a traditional wood-heated neighbourhood sauna that provides an authentic feel for the Finnish sauna culture.

Culture & Architecture

7. Kamppi Chapel of Silence
This fine example of contemporary wooden architecture is a place to meditate in the heart of the city.

8. Oodi Library (Opens in December 2018)
The impressive new central library is an inviting public space that is open to all.

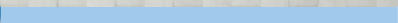
9. Helsinki Music Centre

11. National Museum of Finland

This museum of everyday life offers new perspectives on the history of the city. An entertaining Children’s Town exhibition for young visitors.

26. Natural History Museum
This museum showcases the diversity of nature. A fascinating journey through Finland.

27. Helsinki Zoo
This zoo on the island of Korkeasaari is one of the oldest in the world (est. 1889). Bus 16.

28. Linnanmäki Amusement Park (Open May–Oct)
The 66-year-old wooden rollercoaster is still the most popular ride!

14. Ateneum Art Museum

15. Museum of Contemporary Art Kiasma
16. Amos Rex (Opens in August 2018)

This new art museum presents one of the most extensive private art collections in Finland alongside international contemporary exhibitions.

17. Helsinki Art Museum HAM
The museum maintains and exhibits the city’s art collection. Modern and contemporary art.

19. Kunsthalle Helsinki
In addition to contemporary art, the exhibition programme also includes design and architecture, as well as cross-disciplinary events.

20. Iittala & Arabia Design Centre
Discover two of the most celebrated Finnish design and lifestyle brands: Iittala and Arabia. Trams 6 & 8.

29. Old Market Hall
Since 1889. Wide range of delicacies, several restaurants and cafés.

30. Stockmann’s Department Store
The biggest department store in the entire Nordic region.

31. Kamppi Shopping Center & Kampin Kortteli
Kortteli houses 11 restaurants that are open from morning to late in the evening.

32. Hakaniemi Market Hall
Popular among locals for everyday shopping.

33. Hietalahti Market Hall
Gourmet street food.

Nature & Outdoors

34. Suomenlinna Sea Fortress
One of the most popular attractions in Finland. Guided tours, museums and restaurants.

35. Vallisaari and Lonna Islands (Water Bus May–Sep)
On Vallisaari you can enjoy the archipelago flora and spectacular views. The smaller island of Lonna has a restaurant and sauna.

36. Töölönlahti Bay
The large bay in the centre of the city. One of the most popular jogging spots. Historical wooden villas on the opposite shore.

37. Seurasaari Island and Open-Air Museum
Traditional wooden buildings relocated from across Finland. A popular outdoor recreational area with cafés and restaurants, beaches and events. Bus 24.
