

- Project Members:** Doris Prechel, Ulrike Steinert, Amir Gilan, Maria Molina, Letizia Savino


3. Emotion Lexemes in Akkadian – Preliminary Survey



2. Approaches and Methods

- Corpus-based and comparative approach (genres, contexts, diachronic developments, interlinguistic similarities / differences)
- Cognitive-linguistic approach (e.g. conceptual metaphor)
- Combined semasiological and onomasiological approach
 - focus on the senses/meanings of words, e.g. polysemy and semantic features
 - interest in the relationships of (dis)similarity, hierarchy and interdependence between words in a domain
 - how lexical items capture an area of semantic space

5. Salient Features of Akkadian Emotion Terms

- Abstract terms
- Expressions with body part terms (also figurative)
- Metaphor-induced colexification (typical feeling, physical symptom, behavioural expression, or action tendency associated with an emotion)

- Emotion-related terms (e.g. terms for vocal expressions, bodily reactions)
- Terms spanning different feelings within an emotion domain
- Terms spanning two different emotion domains in comparison with English equivalents (e.g. envy / jealousy)
