

### Conclusions

- Fragments now in CTH 809 → part of *Sammeltafeln* dealing with different kinds of illnesses (?)
- Mesopotamian medical tradition = high consideration in Hattuša
- The differences in *ducti* → several specialists involved
- *Scriptoria* led by foreign specialists in the Hittite capital.
