This programme is for social entrepreneurs from Ireland, Sweden, Finland, Norway and Iceland who are passionate about connecting and learning from their peers around facilitating support for their communities.

14th - 18th October 2024 | 10.00-16:00 each day (with some evening delivery)

Join this 'in person' facilitator development programme, delivered over five consecutive days. The programme will explore tools and techniques to help you develop your facilitation skill and support learning and development in rural communities in your country, as well as allowing you to practise facilitation in a safe space.

The week includes a Leadership Workshop where your will have the opportunity to investigate your own leadership and plan your actions in the project going forward.

After the 'in-person' programme, you will have the opportunity to apply your learning within your own context. Your group will reconnect quarterly, with Online Connect Sessions exploring opportunities/challenges and developing a sustainable Community of Practice.
