


Digital humanities core teaching per period




Digital humanities generic sample curriculum




Digital humanities sample curriculum (cross-lingdig focus)




Digital humanities sample curriculum (cultural studies/museology focus)

- As you can see, there's a lot of room to shape your studies through the electives you take
- Many of the examples here show "extremes" (to show what is possible). In practice, we suggest a balanced approach that relies on our core offerings but broadens into the directions most meaningful to you.
- The best place to search for courses is under studies.helsinki.fi because the search there targets course implementations (where the exact content is defined). The search in SISU targets course units, which are much more generic (course units are the building blocks that define the boundaries of what needs to be in your degree. So for example our degree requirements say that you need to have either two method course units and one applied course units, or two applied and one method course unit. But for you to make a decision on which method and applied courses to take, you'll naturally want to know the details of which methods are covered or what is the project course on, which are in the implementation! [And particularly when looking for courses from other programmes, whether it is useful for you often depends on the details and not which course unit it fulfils in the original programme!])
